- To enroll in HST 422 or HST 423 students must complete all other program and course requirement; have a minimum 3.0 combined gpa in content; and a minimum overall gpa of 2.75 professional education courses, have a C or better in all Education course, and successfully complete Professional E-Portfolio Check Point 2.
- It is recommended that students take the PRAXIS II content exam the semester prior to student teaching. State certification requires a score of 152 or higher.
