<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To enroll in HST 418, Prerequisites include: SEC 302, EDC 350, SPE 340, admission to Teacher Education Program, and completed 12 hours of History courses. HST 418 should be taken the semester prior to Student Teaching. To enroll in HST 422 or HST 423 students must complete all other program and course requirement; have a minimum 2.75 combined gpa in content; and a minimum overall gpa of 2.5 professional education courses, have a C or better in all Education course, and successfully complete Professional E-Portfolio Check Point 2. It is recommended that students take the PRAXIS II content exam the semester prior to student teaching. State certification requires a score of 152 or higher. If you are a transfer student with SEC 302 transfer credit or PEU 15 transfer credit, you must register for the special section of EDC 150 (303). Contact your academic advisor for further information regarding education course transfer credit.
